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Zucchini Bread (This is what you can do with all of them)

3 c. flour
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp baking powder
2 tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
3 eggs
1 c. oil
1 c. sugar
1 c. brown sugar
2 tsp vanilla
3 c. grated zucchini (don't squeeze off liquid)
1 1/2 c. walnuts, chopped
Preheat oven to 325

Combine flour, salt, baking soda, & powder,
cinnamon, and nutmeg. Set aside.

Beat eggs, oil, vanilla, and sugars in a large bowl by
hand or with a mixer until well mixed. Add flour
mixture while continuing to beat until completely
blended.

Add grated zucchini and mix well

Add walnuts and stir.

Grease 2 8x4 loaf pans

Pour batter into loaf pans.

Bake for 45-60 minutes, until toothpick inserted in
the center of the loaf comes out clean.

Cool in pans on a rack for 10 minutes then turn out
onto rack until completely cooled
