Madeline de Jesus was a track and field athlete from Puerto Rico. Her identical twin sister Margaret, who was also an athlete, was present in Los Angeles as a spectator. So Madeline asked Margaret to pretend to be her and enlisted her as an imposter in the 4X400 meters heat. Margaret ran the second leg of the qualifier, and the team advanced. When the chief coach of the Puerto Rican team learned of the ruse, however, he pulled his team out of the final.

Road to Victory

In the 1904 Olympic games, American marathon runner Fred Lorz found himself exhausted after running the first nine miles of the marathon. Lorz then hitched a ride with his manager for the next eleven miles, until the car broke down. Lorz walked the next six miles and won the marathon! Lorz was quickly called out by spectators and he admitted that it was a joke. He may not have had success in the Olympics, but in 1905 he won the Boston Marathon with a time of 2:38:25

Burnt Out

Lighting the Olympic cauldron is a process where the flame, which is lighted several months before the Olympic games, makes a journey from Olympia, Greece to the host city. Back-up flames are kept in case the original gets accidentally extinguished. In 1976, rain put out the flame and it was re-lighted by a plumber using a cigarette lighter. This was not exactly what Olympic officials wanted in the cauldron, so they put the flame out again and used one of the back-up flames.

Perfectly Patriotic Parfait

16 oz. plain Greek yogurt

1 tsp. lemon zest

1/2 tsp. vanilla extract



Combine in a bowl.

Sweeten with your choice of:

1.5 oz. honey - or -

1/3 c. sugar - or -

8 packs of Splenda



In individual parfait or small stemmed glasses, place a layer of blueberries, then 1/2 c. yogurt mixture, and top with cut strawberries.
