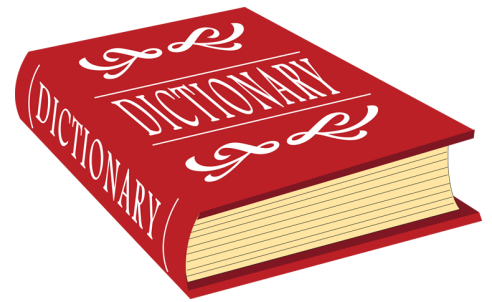

Savory Peanut Butter Dip

1/2 c. smooth peanut butter

1/4 c. minced onion

1/2 c. fresh lemon juice

1 TBSP soy sauce

2 tsp. minced garlic

1 tsp. ground coriander

1/4 c. minced fresh parsley
