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Creamy Cheesecake

Ingredients	9" springform pan	10" springform pan
Graham crackers, crushed	1 1/4 c.	2 c.
Sugar	3 Tbsp	1/4 c.
Butter, melted	6 Tbsp	1 stick
Cream cheese, softened	4x - 8oz packs	5x - 8oz packs
Sugar	1 3/4 c.	2 1/4 c.
Flour	3 Tbsp	1/4 c.
Eggs, lightly beaten	6	8
Egg yolks, lightly beaten	2	2
Sour cream	1 c.	1 1/4 c.
Heavy cream	1/2 c.	2/3 c.
Vanilla	2 tsp	2 1/2 tsp

For crust - combine crushed grahams, sugar, and butter then press all (reserving 1/2 c. or 3/4 c.) into the bottom of the springform pan.

Bake for 6 minutes in preheated oven at 425°. Let crust cool before adding cream cheese mixture.

Preheat oven to 300°. If you have just finished the crust, open the oven door to allow the interior to cool somewhat before lowering the temperature to 300°.

Beat cream cheese until light. Add sugar and beat at low speed until smooth, then add flour until mixed. Continue beating, drizzle in eggs and yolks mixture, and then add sour cream, heavy cream, and vanilla until consistency is smooth. Do not over mix!

Pour mixture into springform pan. Place a cookie sheet with sides, or a jelly-roll pan on the bottom rack of the oven in case the pan leaks. Place the cheesecake on an oven rack in the middle of the oven.

Bake 9" pan for 70 minutes. Turn off the oven, but keep the cake inside for another 60 minutes.

Bake 10" pan for 90 minutes. Turn off the oven, but keep the cake inside for another 90 minutes.

Remove from oven and cool completely in the full pan, then refrigerate. Refrigerate for at 6 hours before cutting. Remove side of pan before cutting. The 9" pan make approx. 16 slices. The 10" pan makes approx. 20 slices.
