The Smoot is a unit of length, defined as the height of Oliver R. Smoot, who later became the Chairman of the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), and then the president of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). The unit is used to measure the length of the Harvard Bridge. In 1958 when Smoot was a Lambda Chi Alpha pledge at MIT (class of 1962), the bridge was measured to be 364.4 Smoots, plus or minus one ear, using Mr. Smoot himself as a ruler. At the time, Smoot was 5 feet, 7 inches, or 170 cm, tall.

Google Earth and Google Calculator include the smoot as a unit of measurement.

An Amazing Bird

The US Army Signal Corps in France during World War I had a lot to thank Cher Ami the homing pigeon for. During a particularly deadly battle, Ami was one of 600 pigeons given to the regiment by British breeders, so that the Americans in France could train them for mes-saging duties.

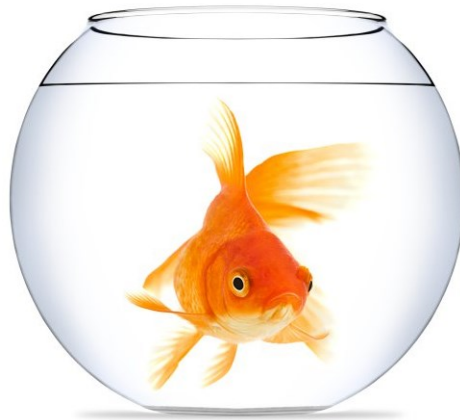
Ami flew a total of 12 important missions over several months in 1918, and his final journey took place on the afternoon of October 4, 1918 during the Battle of the Argonne. The corps were being shelled by their own men at the time, and Major Whittlesey, the officer in charge, sent Cher Ami off with a little note attached to his leg telling them to stop it. Even though badly wounded in the chest, blinded in one eye, and with one leg hanging off, the little bird managed to carry the message, and saved the lives of more than 200 men.

He was patched up after his momentous flight and even given a wooden leg, but unfortu-nately died less than a year later.

Mom's Pot Roast

- 2-3# boneless beef chuck roast
- 1 tsp sugar
- 2 TBSP vinegar
- Package dry onion soup mix
- 1 can mushroom soup
- 1 soup can-full of water
- 2-3# small potatoes, cut in half
- 1# carrots, cut in 2" chunks

Pre-heat oven to 325°F.

Place the meat in the center of a 13"x9" pan or 7 quart Dutch oven pot. Sprinkle sugar evenly over meat, then pour vinegar over sugar. Next, sprinkle dry soup mix over all, then spread mushroom soup on top; pour water half on meat and half around edges. Seal pan tightly with aluminum foil or lid and cook in oven for 1 1/2 hours.

Remove pan from oven and remove foil/lid. Add potatoes and carrots to pan, then recover with foil/lid and return to the oven for an additional 1 1/2 hours.

Pairs well with a crusty loaf of bread and applesauce.
