

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Hibachi-Style Vegetables

- 2-3 small zucchini cut with skin on into 1/2" x 2" strips
- 2-3 small onions cut into 1/2" wide strips
- 1 TBSP minced garlic
- 1 TBSP vegetable oil
- 1/2 stick butter
- 1-2 TBSP soy sauce
- 2 TBSP sesame seeds

Note:

If the skillet is not very large, try 2 smaller batches

Heat a very large skillet over med-high heat
Add oil and garlic - stir for 30 seconds
Add zucchini, onion, and butter
Stir fry until vegetables begin to brown.
Add soy sauce and stir fry for one minute
Add sesame seeds just prior to serving
(Serving straight from the pan piping hot is best)
